- 4 Parish Council Chairman's Report Councillor Smith-Vincent spoke of the work undertaken during the last 12 month which had included:

Considerable discussion took place about the proposed planning application at Apple Cross Fields for the erection of a large agricultural building. The application is within the parish of Tysoe but residents voiced several objections to the proposal which would be raised with the Tysoe PC.

Concern was raised about speeding through the village particularly along Tysoe Road. It was agreed that the PC would contact County Highways to request that the white road SLOW signs need to be reinstated and some of the 30mph repeater signs need replacing.

Other Matters Raised by an Elector of the Parish: A resident thanked the Chairman and the other Councillors for their hard work through a difficult 12 months and the management of the budget particularly the reduction in the precept.
