Radway Project - Playground Toddler Area, by Sophie Stephens

The idea started in my head in June 2018. *"Let's raise money to upgrade the village playground"* I thought! Well, fast forward to now, November 2019, 17 Months later, £32,331 raised, a lot of time, effort and care spent, and here we are!

This was all achieved by:

- 1. A questionnaire to gain feedback and thoughts from our community.
- 2. Many hours of research into grants available and completing a vast amount of grant applications that we thought we might qualify for. We received money from five in total.
- 3. Holding fundraising events. A weekend event celebrating 100 years since women won the right to vote, and a rather fun Wine Tasting and Auction evening.
- 4. The generosity of many local companies who donated prizes for our raffles and auctions.
- 5. Receiving many kind donations of money along the way from members of the community.
- 6. Working very closely with the Parish Council (previous councillors and new), and reporting progress at each meeting.
- 7. Working closely with the playground companies to gain quotes, ideas, and to finalise the design. This evolved and changed many times as anything does throughout the lifecycle of any project.
- 8. A lot of support from our village groups The Chambers Trust, and the Radway Events Group (REG) in terms of time from people and money.
- 9. Support from our whole community especially with time given towards running the fundraising events.
- 10. A maintenance day to tidy up the existing equipment to ensure it is well looked after, and to aid decisions on what was essential to replace or keep once the equipment was assessed following the annual inspection report. This took a working group 8 hours.
- 11. Carrying out a Level Survey of the recreation ground.
- 12. Submitting and gaining approval of a planning application.
- 13. Structural calculations from a structural engineer.
- 14. Many design meetings, and re-design meetings with Kompan, the playground company.

James Stephens who worked hard on ensuring the Level Survey and structural calculations was carried out and Planning Application he submitted was approved but also in terms of the large amount of days he spent in manual labour working hard to ensure everything was ready before the work could start.

Julian Douthwaite, from Townsend Farm, with his tractor on hand to help us during the works, to move anything required and in tidying up all the turf that was dug out. Many of the big delivery lorries and trucks could not access the large concrete hard standing area which is where the tractor proved so helpful.


