#### **Parish Council news**

**Outdoor table tennis** The Parish Council's application for a grant of £400 from Warwickshire County Council towards the cost of an outdoor table

tennis table has been successful. This will cover the majority of the cost with balance being met equally between the Chamber's Trust and the Parish Council. The table will be sited on the hard-standing area of the recreation ground.

**Public footpaths** In an attempt to lessen the muddy paths around the village laying bark will be used on the very popular paths to counteract the mud. The pathway by the cartwash again has been flooded and this has been reported to County Highways. Please notify Clare Rankin of any issues concerned with the public footpaths around the village.

**Clearing grids** Ensuring that the grids are clear of leaves is particularly important at this time of year to reduce the risk of floods. Residents are requested to regularly check that grids near their properties are clear.

**Old Graveyard** The new bench has now been installed on a temporary base and the daffodil bulbs have been planted. A grant application will be submitted soon to Cotswold National Landscape, to cover the cost of further improvements which will include the removal of a sycamore and ivy bush, a permanent base for the bench and an information board, as well surveying the headstones and securing the listed headstone.

**Village Christmas tree** We are very grateful to Hadsham Farm, Horley for their generous support in providing this year's Christmas tree for a donation of £20 to their village charity, The Michael Harding Trust.

**Parish Council Meeting** It is planned to hold a virtual meeting across the internet on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> January at 8.00pm using Zoom.
