Parish Council

General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

King John's Lane - bridleway

The first phase of improvements to the bridleway is now complete. The brambles and saplings along the bridleway have been cut back, the trees pruned, the ditch cleared and a land drain across the bridleway installed. Financial support for this work has been provided by the British Horse Society, Warwickshire County Council, Warwickshire Wildlife Trust and the Parish Council. Generous donations from residents and local livery stables amounting to £550.00 have also been received. Many thanks to everyone who has worked on the project and to those residents who have contributed towards the cost. Further donations towards the cost of the work and towards ongoing maintenance can be made by contacting the Parish Clerk.

Parish Assembly

Fifteen people attended the Parish Assembly and discussed a number of topics including traffic calming, the development at Applecross Fields, a Parish Plan for Radway, LED street lights and Western Power's plans for overhead cables. These issues are regularly being reviewed by the Parish Council.

Defibrillator

It is hoped that a defibrillator will shortly be available in Radway. West Midlands Ambulance Service have advised the Parish Council on what defibrillator to purchase and they will provide training on its use for villagers. The location of the defibrillator is now being assessed and it is hoped it will be installed very soon.
