In Memory of Lloyd Welsby

It is with great sadness that the village learnt that Lloyd Welsby died peacefully with his family around him on February 1st.

Many of you will know that Lloyd was born in the village at what is now no. 4 Grange Cottages, and lived there until he was 15, when he went to live in Lighthorne and learned the trade of a carpenter. At the age of 18 he was sent to Korea, where he endured unspeakable hardship.

Lloyd returned to Radway when he married Jean and worked tirelessly for the good of the village. He was on the Parish Council for eleven years (many of those as Chair), he helped renovate the Village Hall and was a Trustee of Tysoe School. His passion for his garden made him a staunch member of the Garden Club and his skill as a carpenter is apparent in the gates he made for the church.

Lloyd was chairman of the Cricket Club for many years during its early development and helped to create the current Cricket Field on the Tysoe Road. The site was formerly used for allotments and took a lot of hard work to get to a playable condition. Lloyd then took on the role of groundsman, spending many hours cutting the grass and preparing the pitches.

Parish Council News 20's Plenty

There has been overwhelming support to reduce the speed limit through the village to 20mph. The Parish Council will, at its next meeting, agree to lobby Warwickshire County Highways Authority to change the speed limit through the village.

Defibrillator

The defibrillator is now in place and is located to the side of the front porch of the village hall. Should you need to access it follow the instructions on

the front of the "defibsafe" by ringing either 999 or 112 who will give you the access code. It is planned that training on the use of the defibrillator will be provided by West Midlands Ambulance Services in the near future.

Forestry Work on Upton Estate 2022

Substantial forestry work on Sunrising Hill, due to widespread Ash Dieback, has now been completed and the re-planting is due to start imminently. A similar process will now begin in the woodland off Edgehill which will start with the construction of the infrastructure for the forestry machinery. The felling will then start in the summer. While still relatively extensive, the woodland will not need to be clear-felled as it was on Sunrising Hill; this will be more of a thinning process. It is our understanding that the existing bridleway which passes through the woodland should not be affected. Further information is available on the village notice boards.
