Parish Council News Acorn Bioenergy Anaerobic Digestion

The open meeting held in the village hall on 10th November was attended by over 40 residents. The views expressed were overwhelmingly against the planning application for an anaerobic digester. The Parish Council has formally objected to the application and has encouraged as many residents as possible to object as well. Over 1000 objections have been sent to Stratford-on-Avon District Council. A decision on the application will be made in the New Year.

The Old Graveyard, Westend

In spite of the inclement weather the unveiling of the interpretation was well attended with over 50 people present. The information provided on the interpretation panel has been very well received.

Precept 2023/24

The precept for 2022/23 was increased by 2% giving a total income of £12,060.00. The inflationary pressure on residents will be considerable in the coming year given that inflation is currently 11.1%. It was therefore agreed that the percentage increase to the precept is maintained at the same level as in 2022/23, that is 2%.

The Stratford Energy Support Fund 2022

The scheme is administered and managed by Act on Energy on behalf of Stratford-on-Avon District Council who are offering financial support this winter for vulnerable households who are struggling to pay their energy bills. All homeowners, private rented tenants and housing association/Council tenants, can apply or be referred for fuel vouchers or fuel payments if they:

- Live in the Stratford-on-Avon District
- Have a combined gross household income of no more than £30,000.00 per year.
- Have no household savings

• Have someone living in the home with a vulnerability If you satisfy ALL the 4 criteria above, you can apply for support through the Stratford Energy Support Fund. Conserving and enhancing Dark Skies

Dark Skies are important for landscape, heritage, wildlife, recreation and enjoyment and health and wellbeing. Dark Skies are an identified "Special Quality" of our designated landscape but they are under continued pressure from increasing light pollution from commercial and domestic security lighting, development and street lighting. The Cotswold National Landscape (CNL) is seeking the Parish Council's view on the importance of dark skies and whether there is support for doing more.
