# **Acorn Bioenergy Anaerobic Digestion**

It is now over 12 months since the original planning application was submitted by Acorn. The planning application has recently been amended which has necessitated a further round of comments. The Parish Council has again objected to the application, along with many villagers. Comments can be viewed on the Stratford DC planning portal. The number of objections clearly demonstrates that residents of Tysoe and the surrounding parishes have not given up and the objections are as vigorous as they ever were.

# **Community Marquee**

It has been agreed to purchase a  $5 \times 10$  m community marquee for the village. This will have a steel frame and a high-quality white canvas. The best price is now been sought from a number of suppliers. We look forward to the new marquee being used in the next year.

#### Jacob's Ladder

Meetings have recently taken place between Warwickshire CC and contractors for the installation of a handrail for the three flights of steps. Hopefully the handrail will be installed early in the new year.

# **Glebe Field change of use Planning Application**

The application to change the use of the stables into a holiday let, the first application having been refused by Stratford District Council, has again been refused. With two refusals hopefully no more applications will be submitted.

A new website is being developed by Zanna Mckail which will be launched in December. The new website will be easier to update and navigate and will ultimately provide more information about the village.
