Parish Council News

Thank you

The gullies that cut across the grass verge, from the road to the ditch, along Tysoe Road, have been excavated and cleaned out. A big thank you to the person who has undertaken this job. It is much appreciated and has significantly improved the water drainage off the road

Block grids and pavement

The blocked grids/drains on Farnborough Road and Tysoe Road have been reported to County Highways. They will be added to the list to be jetted. The hole in the pavement on Farnborough Road has been temporarily filled to make it safe but will be properly repaired in the near future. Residents are reminded that they can report road faults directly via <u>www.fixmystreet.com</u>

Damage to the Recreation Ground

Unfortunately, a resident skidded off the Tysoe Road going through the hedge/fence and damaging the climbing frame. Fortunately, no one was hurt in the accident. The fence has already been replaced and the Council is awaiting a report on the repair of the climbing frame.

Until the climbing frame is made safe it should not be used and is taped off.

Street lighting

The Council has been exploring the replacement of the current, obsolete lamps, with E-on. New LED lamps are available which will be less expensive to run and maintain. The new lamps will be warm white and can be fitted with deflectors to direct the light thus shielding nearby properties. It is intended to make a decision at the March Council meeting but in the meantime if you have any thoughts about the lighting in the village, please contact any of the Parish Councillors to share your ideas.

Anaerobic Digester

A decision from Stratford District Council is still awaited.

Handrail for Jacob's Ladder

Funding has been made available from our County Councillors '(Chris Mills) budget to reinstate the hand rail on Jacob's Ladder. Further funding has been applied for from Cotswold National Landscape (CNL) to enable the handrail to made from recycled plastic rather than a basic steel rail. A decision from CNL is expected soon.

Climate Change

Carbon Neutral authority by 2025

Reduce district wide emissions by 55% by 2030

Adaptation by 2050 - to enable our communities to have adapted to the potential of at least a 3 degrees rise in global temperatures.
