## Repairs to the Climbing frame

The climbing frame in the recreation ground will be repaired on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

#### Handrail for Jacob's Ladder

Further funding has been secured from Cotswold National Landscape (CNL) to enable the handrail to be made from recycled plastic rather than a basic steel rail. Warwickshire County Council can now proceed to install the new handrail.

## **Planning applications**

Applecross Fields, Tysoe Road, have applied to change the use of the land from agricultural to community use, reflecting its use by Woods and Wellies. The PC raised concerns about the validity of the application and Stratford have determined that the application should have had a "Heritage Statement". This will address the impact of the development on its setting

and neighbouring heritage assets which include the Battlefields Trust, Cotswold National Landscape and Warwickshire Wildlife Trust. When the application has been re-validated a fresh 15 working day consultation period will start.

Millstone Cottage has applied for planning permission to build a single storey garage to the side of the property. No objection.

## Recycling

We are all trying to do our bit to protect the environment, and here is some information to help us all reduce what goes into our black bins.

Stratford District Council do offer to collect items by the side of your bin, these include:

### **Textiles, Small Electrical Equipment and Household Batteries:**

These can be left on top of the lid / or by the side (not inside) of your blue-lidded bin, green bin or grey bin on your scheduled collection day, not on a food waste bin collection day. In order for these items to be collected and recycled, they must be small enough to fit into the storage facility underneath the refuse collection vehicles.

Coffee Pods - A new service has been launched with PodBack together with Stratford District Council to recycle coffee pods. If you need more information please visit <a href="stratford.gov.uk/podback">stratford.gov.uk/podback</a> or speak to Penny Gardner. Free of charge bags will be provided to you for you to fill. The bags can then be left on top of the lid / or by the side of your blue-lidded bin, green bin or grey bin on your scheduled collection day.
