Mothering Sunday

March 2024

Thirty years ago, as a newish curate in High Wycombe, I was invited to speak about Mothering Sunday on local radio. I haven't done a broadcast since, so perhaps it wasn't a success – I know I was very nervous! Even back then, the day was often referred to as Mother's Day, and nowadays, you

hardly ever hear the old term Mothering Sunday, and it's challenging to find a card for your mother that uses the previous name, rather than Mother's Day.

The origin of Mothering Sunday lies in the medieval period. On that day, people went back to the church where they

were baptised, often the local cathedral, as it was the 'mother church.' Later, the day was celebrated by domestic servants, who were given a day off from their work to visit their mothers and families. They took Simnel cake as a gift, and often, a small bunch of flowers – violets if they were available. As a child, I always looked for sweet-smelling wild violets to pick for my mother on Mothering Sunday, and one of my daughters bought me a violet plant so she could continue the tradition.

Behind the Mothering Sunday celebration lies the idea too, that Jesus used language that implies mothering when he entered Jerusalem on the day we remember as Palm Sunday, and the Hebrew Bible (the Old Testament) includes the image of God as a mother in several places. For example, in the Book of Isaiah, the prophet records that God says, 'Can a woman forget her nursing child, or show no compassion for the child of her womb? Even if these forget, yet I will not forget you." These words can bring comfort to anyone who was abandoned by their mother as a child. Those of us whose mothers have



died, can also be reassured that God's love for us never ends.

Many churches continue the tradition of Mothering Sunday today, celebrating not just mothers, but also single people, childless couples, and anyone who 'mothers' someone else, for example, those

> who mentor us, or help us fulfil our potential in any way. Usually, bunches of flowers including daffodils are made up for everyone to give to a person who has 'mothered' us in a positive way. It's a joyful opportunity to present a small bunch of flowers to someone whom we appre-

ciate.

Mothering Sunday this year falls on March 10th, and we welcome everyone to our services at Combroke (9am), Kineton (10am), and Warmington (10.30am) that day.

I hope you can join us at one of them.
