LCE Fund pumps £2.5million into businesses in two years

A scheme launched by Warwickshire County Council to give a helping hand to start-up, micro, small and medium businesses has distributed nearly £2.5 million of funding in less than two years. The Local Communities & Enterprise Fund (LCE) was started in June 2022 to provide loans to businesses who were struggling to access lending by the usual High Street banking routes. It has now distributed over £2,484,368 in loans between 44 businesses as well as social enterprises. The LCE Fund, which is delivered by Coventry and Warwickshire Reinvestment Trust (CWRT), is part of the County Council's £64 million Warwickshire Investment Fund (WIF), to boost the county's post-pandemic economic recovery.

Warwickshire chosen as pathfinder for national reform of children's social care services

Warwickshire County Council has been successful in its application to the Department for Education for Wave 2 of the Families First for Children Pathfinder Programme. Warwickshire is one of the seven new areas to deliver the programme which aims to improve services to help more children stay with their families in safe and loving homes. The programme will make sure targeted early help is available for families suffering domestic abuse, addiction, or poor mental health. Where child protection is necessary, it will be carried out by social workers with greater expertise and experience, and the wider family will stay involved in decision-making. HUGS 2

The cost of heating homes has stabilised somewhat by the Government caping energy bills. The fact is however that even in South Warwickshire there are those in fuel poverty, a need to improve insulation in old properties, and inevitably, Winter is coming. The HUGS 2 scheme, that is Homes Upgrade Grant -2 is available for those that can benefit from insulation and boiler up-grades. **Funding is available to houses which don't use mains gas for heating**. The Home Upgrade Grant phase 2 (HUG2) funding is provided by the Department of Energy Security and Net Zero to help make cold homes more energy efficient and reduce fuel bills for heating.

Upper Lighthorne Medical Centre

NHS Coventry and Warwickshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) has awarded St Wulfstan Surgery the contract to deliver GP services to Upper Lighthorne.

After persistent lobbying from local parishes and SDC, Upper Lighthorne was finally recognised as an area needing additional primary care provision due to the new housing development, which is part of Stratford District Council's core strategy and will see 3,000 new homes built over a 10-year period - potentially increasing the local population by more than 7,000.

St Wulfstan is rated Outstanding by the CQC and was rated the tenth best practice in England, and first for practices with over 10,000 patients.

The new branch practice is set to open in summer 2027 as part of the new village centre. The new premises are part of a joint development with Stratford District Council.

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Sir Jeremy Wright MP, Member of Parliament for Kenilworth and Southam who's strong support for the much needed facility helped to bring a successful conclusion to the campaign organised by local people, said:

"I am pleased to see the ICB has now awarded the contract to supply GP services from the new facility to St Wulfstan Surgery who already look after the patients in Southam and surrounding areas."

"This is an important step towards providing medical facilities on site at Upper Lighthorne."
