### **Parish Council**

### The Annual General Meeting and Ordinary Meeting

At the AGM held on 16<sup>th</sup> May, Tim Smith-Vincent stepped down as Chair of the Parish Council after six years in the role. Tim will stay on as a councillor. Simon Hooker is the new Chair with Penny Gardner taking over as Vice Chair from Simon. The Parish Council, and I am sure the whole village, would like to thank Tim for the fantastic job he has done as Chair – bringing new energy to the Parish Council and a focus on village improvement and community which has benefited us all. Thank you Tim.

The Parish Assembly also took place on 16<sup>th</sup> May. An example of the new LED type street light was shown to residents who attended the meeting. The new lights will be less expensive to run which is important as the cost of the electricity for the current, obsolete lamps has gone up by nearly 50% since last year. The current plan is to have the new lamps installed before autumn / winter this year.

### Jacob's Ladder

Warwickshire County Council have now started to install the new handrail for Jacobs Ladder. At time of writing, the new posts have been installed and it is anticipated that the handrail itself will be added in the next few weeks. This should make the steps easier to manage for everyone on their walks over the long hot summer ahead!

# King John's Lane

Although the Council has no responsibility for pathways and bridleways, we are trying to facilitate improving this historical lane for walkers and horse riders. Improvements were made some years ago to the lower section of the lane which has made a significant difference.

The application to Cotswold National Landscape for funding to facilitate improvements to the upper part of the lane was successful, with the organisation offering a grant of up to £2,000 for the works that need to be undertaken. This leaves the Parish Council with a shortfall of about £1,000 against the total anticipated costs of the work needed of about £3,000. The Parish Council will continue to seek additional funding from Warwickshire County Council, the British Horse Society, Upton Estate, the Ramblers Association and local liveries. Further contributions from residents would also be very much appreciated.

### **Anaerobic Digester**

A decision from Stratford District Council is still awaited.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on the 18<sup>th</sup> July 2024. All residents are welcome to attend and, as usual, there will be an opportunity for residents to raise any issues with the Councillors.
