Parish Council News Hedge Cutting

Autumn is an ideal time to cut back hedges from footpaths and the relatively narrow roads we have running through the village. The Parish Council does not have the resources to do this and so relies on the goodwill of villagers to maintain their respective hedgerows to ensure they do not obstruct or restrict footpaths and roads in the village.

Road Closure

You have probably seen the road signs at either end of Langdon Lane to warn of the planned closure of the road between Sunday 2nd and Tuesday 4th November. The closure will start at the edge of the village to where Langdon Lane joins the B4086. The notice the Parish Council has received says that this is for "trial works to prepare for water pipe replacement". As with the recent footpath renovation, vehicle access will be maintained wherever possible, but we can all expect some disruption and the need to use a longer route to Kineton via Tysoe and Farnborough Roads. Given that this is a "trial works" closure we can expect there to be future disruption at some point when the full water pipe replacement is done. The Parish Council have no knowledge of this at present, but will obviously keep you posted as and when we hear anything.

Roof Repair and Restoration
